PUBLIC SERVICE APPEALS BOARD

ELECTION OF MEMBERS

<u>WHEREAS</u> Article 70 (1) of the Constitution provides for a Public Service Appeals Board consisting of the Chief Justice, one member appointed by Cabinet and one member elected by permanent public officers;

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> Section 71 (1) of the Public Service Act 1998 provides that the election of the members to be elected by permanent public officers (contributors to the Superannuation Fund) shall be conducted in such manner as the Cabinet, by notice in the gazette, determines;

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> it is presently necessary to cause such election and issue directions to that end;

<u>NOW THEREFORE</u> that Cabinet has, on the date last mentioned herein, determined as follows: -

- 1. The Returning Officer shall, in consultation with the Chief Secretary make all necessary arrangements for the conduct of the election and shall prepare a list, Department by Department, of all persons, who are or will be permanent officers of the Public Service on the day appointed for the election.
- 2. Nominations shall be in writing and in the following form: -

The Nomination Forms shall be made available in all governments offices:

- 3. Nominations must be lodged with the Returning Officer before 5:00 p.m. on Friday 27th June 2003, the time for closure of nominations.
- 4. Each nomination form shall be signed by the candidate who is a permanent Public Officer and by five other permanent Public Officers.
- 5. A candidate may withdraw his nomination at any time before the closure of nominations to the Returning Officer.
- 6. The Returning Officer shall publicise the names of the candidates as soon as practicable after the closure of the nominations.
- 7. The election shall be held on Monday 30th June, 2003 between 12:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. office hours and permanent Public Officers shall cast their vote at the following stations:

POLLING STATION

PERMANENT PUBLIC OFFICES ON STAFF OF:

(a)	Government Office (Registry)	The Secretariat, Parliament, Island Economic & Development, Directorate of Police, Directorate of Education, Lands & Survey, Rontel, Department of Audit.
(b)	Nauru General Hospital	Department of Health & Medical Services and Nauru Works Department.

- 8. The Returning officer shall appoint a person to preside at each Polling Station.
- 9. Each Ballot paper for the election shall be similar to that used for elections under the provisions of the <u>Electoral Act</u> 1963-1973 and a Ballot Paper shall be invalid if it does not comply with the provisions of Section 21 of that Act.
- 10. The results of the election shall be determined as if the provisions of Section 27 of the <u>Electoral Act</u> shall apply.
- 11. The District Court shall be the Court of Disputed Elections and any dispute concerning the election be determined as if the provisions of Part VI of <u>Electoral Act</u> shall apply.
