CUSTOMS (EXTENSION OF IMPORT LICENCE DUE DATE) ORDER No. 1, 2014
S.L No. 16

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 91 (3) of the Customs Act 2014, and with the approval of Cabinet, as Acting Minister responsible for Customs, I make the following Order:

1 Citation

This Order shall be cited as the *Customs (Extension of Import Licence Due Date) Order No. 1, 2014*.

2 Commencement

This Order shall commence on the date it is gazetted.

3 Amendment of *Customs (Prohibition of Imports) Proclamation No. 1, 2014*.

- (1) The effective date for Import Licences is extended from 1st October 2014 to 1st November 2014.
- (2) Order 3 (1) above does not apply to Importers who are currently importing bottled water.

Cabinet makes the following regulations under section 132 of the *Motor Traffic Act 2014*:

1 Short title

These Regulations may be cited as the *Motor Traffic (Amendment) Regulations No. 1, 2014*.

2 Commencement

These Regulations commence on the day on which they are published in the Gazette.

3 Act Amended

The Schedule amends the *Motor Traffic Regulations 2014*.

SCHEDULE - AMENDMENT OF MOTOR TRAFFIC REGULATIONS 2014

[1] Amendment of Regulation 6 (1) (c)

Omit

‘for the official vehicles of members of the Diplomatic Corps—the letters “DC” followed by numerals, in black on a white background’

Substitute

‘for the official vehicles of members of the Diplomatic Corp – a maximum of three letters identifying the country followed by the letters DC and followed by numerals beginning with 01’.
