# ADMINISTRATION CONTRACTS ORDINANCE 1950 (1) (2)

No. 19 of 1950.

## An Ordinance to authorize the Making of Contracts by the Administrator.

E it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Papua and New Guinea Act 1949, as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Administration Contracts Short title. Ordinance 1950. (1) (2)
- 2. The Ordinances specified in the Schedule to this Ordinance Repeal. are repealed.
- 3. Subject to this Ordinance, the Administrator may, on behalf Administrator of the Commonwealth in its administration of the Territory, enter may enter into into and execute any contract or agreement which, in his opinion, it is necessary or desirable to make or enter into in the public interests of the Territory.

### PART A: ADMINISTRATOR'S POWERS—

Contracts involving expenditure exceeding £15,000. **4.** The Administrator shall not enter into or execute any contract or agreement under this Ordinance which involves an expenditure exceeding  $[Fifteen^{(3)}]$  thousand pounds unless he has first obtained the approval in writing of the Minister.
