PART B: HEALTH—

Territory of Papua and all other powers me enabling, hereby declare the following to be Dangerous Drugs for the purpose of the said Ordinance:—

1. Hydro-Chloride of 1-methyl-4-phenyl-piperidine-4-carboxylic acid ethyl ester, whether known under the names of Dolantin, Demerol, Pethridine, Dolosal or Isonipecaine or otherwise.

2. Preparations made from extract or tincture of Indian Hemp.

3. dl-2-dimethylamino-r; 4-diphenylhepten-5-one hydrochloride whether known under the names of Amidone, Methadon, Physeptone, Dolophine or Adanon or otherwise and any other drug of the "Amidone" group whether known by any of the foregoing names or otherwise.

4. Methyldihydromorphinone Hydrochloride (Metopon Hydro-

chloride) a morphine derivative.
