LIQUOR (NEW GUINEA) ORDINANCE 1951.⁽¹⁾ No. 22 of 1951.

An Ordinance to amend the Liquor Ordinance 1931-1950 of the Territory of New Guinea.

B E it ordained by the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Papua and New Guinea Act 1949-1950, as follows:--

Short title and citation. **1.**--(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Liquor (New Guinea) Ordinance $1951.^{(1)}$

Liquor (New Guinea) Ordinance 1951-cont.

(2.) The Liquor Ordinance 1931-1950⁽²⁾ of the Territory of New Guinea is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Liquor Ordinance 1931-1951.

2. This Ordinance shall come into operation on a date to be commencement. fixed by the Administrator by notice in the Gazette.⁽¹⁾

3. Section six of the Principal Ordinance is amended—

(a) by omitting from paragraph (e) the word "or"; and Ordinance.

(b) by adding after paragraph (f) the following paragraph :---

> "; or (g) the sale of liquor during an actual flight of an aircraft, to a passenger in the aircraft, where the sale is made by or on behalf of the owner of the aircraft and the liquor is sold for the purpose of being consumed during that flight.".
