LOST REGISTERS ORDINANCE 1950.⁽¹⁾

No. 16 of 1950.

An Ordinance to provide for the transfer and keeping of Registers opened and kept under the National Security (External Territories) Regulations of the Commonwealth, and for other purposes.

B it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Papua and New Guinea Act 1949, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Lost Registers Ordinance 1950.⁽¹⁾

2. This Ordinance shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and fifty.

3. In this Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears— "lost register" means any register kept on and before the twelfth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two, in pursuance of any law of the Territory of Papua or the Territory of New Guinea, which—

- (a) by reason of circumstances arising out of the recent war, has been lost or destroyed or is not accessible; and
 - (b) is declared by the Administrator by notice⁽²⁾ in the Gazette to be a lost register;

"the recent war" means the war with Germany which commenced on the third day of September, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, and includes any other war in which His Majesty became engaged after that date and before the commencement of this Ordinance.

4. Where a register has been opened and kept in pursuance of regulation twenty-one A of the National Security (External Territories) Regulations⁽³⁾ of the Commonwealth in lieu of a lost

5. Where evidence is produced to the satisfaction of the officer Entries in to whom a register is transferred in pursuance of section four of transferred registers. this Ordinance that any matter or thing may reasonably be presumed to have been entered in the lost register which that register replaces he may, in his discretion, enter in the register such particulars of that matter or thing as it is established to his satisfaction may reasonably be presumed to have been entered in the lost register, and such other particulars as he considers expedient.

6 — (1.) The officer to whom a register is transferred in Copies and pursuance of section four of this Ordinance may issue-

- (a) a copy of, or extract from, that register; or
- (b) a certificate or other document based on an entry in that register.

(2.) There shall be payable in respect of the issue of a document in pursuance of this section the same fee as would be payable in respect of the issue of a similar document under the law of the Territory of Papua or the Territory of New Guinea, as the case may be.

7.—(1.) An entry in a register transferred to an officer in Effect of pursuance of section four of this Ordinance, and a copy, extract, extracts, &c., certificate or other document, made or issued in pursuance of this from transferred registers. Ordinance shall, in all courts and before all persons, have the same force and effect as if the entry were an entry duly made in the lost register, or as if the copy, extract, certificate or other document was based on the lost register and was duly issued by a person authorized to issue those documents under the law of the Territory of Papua or the Territory of New Guinea, as the case may be.

(2.) For the purposes of this section, an entry made or a copy, extract, certificate or other document issued before the commencement of this Ordinance in pursuance of regulation twentyone A of the National Security (External Territories) Regulations⁽³⁾ of the Commonwealth in respect of a register opened and kept under that regulation in lieu of a lost register shall be deemed to have been made or issued in pursuance of this Ordinance.
