## SHIPPING (MARITIME CONVENTION) (NEW GUINEA) ORDINANCE 1950.<sup>(1)</sup>

## No. 11 of 1950.

## An Ordinance to amend the Shipping (Maritime Convention) Ordinance, 1937 of the Territory of New Guinea.

**B**<sup>E</sup> it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Papua and New Guinea Act 1949, as follows:—

Short title and citation. 1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Shipping (Maritime Convention) (New Guinca) Ordinance 1950.<sup>(1)</sup>

(2.) The Shipping (Maritime Convention) Ordinance 1937<sup>(2)</sup> of the Territory of New Guinea is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Shipping (Maritime Convention) Ordinance 1937-1950.

2. This Ordinance shall come into operation on a date to be commencement fixed by the Administrator by notice in the *Gazette*.<sup>(1)</sup>

3. Section two of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting from sub-section (4.) the words "other than a native".
