## SUPPLY ORDINANCE (No. 2) 1949-50. ${ }^{(1)}$

## No. 6 of 1949.

## An Ordinance to grant and apply out of the Public Revenue a sum for the Service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Fapua and New Guinea Act 1949, as follows:-

Short title.

Grant of £1,334,000.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Supply Ordinance (No. 2) 1949-50. ${ }^{(1)}$
2. Subject to authorization from the Administrator, the Treasurer may issue out of the Public Revenue and apply for the service of the financial year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, the sum of one million, three hundred and thirty-four thousand pounds.

Appropriation.
3. The sum granted by this Ordinance is additional to the sum granted by the Supply Ordinance (No. 1) 1949-50 ${ }^{(2)}$ and is appropriated for the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule to this Ordinance in relation to the financial year ending the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and fifty.

Date of commencement.
4. This Ordinance shall take effect from the first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine.

## THE SCHEDULE.

ADVANCE TO THE TREASURER.
To enable the Treasurer to make advances to public officers and to meet annual expenditure for the financial year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, particulars of which afterwards will be included in an Appropriation Ordinance.
