DECENTRALIZATION AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT REGIONS ACT NO. 1 OF 1994

LOCAL GOVERNMENT COUNCILS ELECTION
(AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS NO. 2S OF 1994

To amend the Local Government Council Election Rules Order Nos 61 of 1982.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 35 of the Decentralization and Local Government Regions Act No: 1 of 1994, I, CHARLIE NAKO, Minister of Home Affairs, make the following tegulations:-

DEFINITION

1. In these Regulations "Order" means the Local Government Council Elections Rules Order No: 61 of 1982*

AMENDMENT OF RULE 1 OF THE ORDER
2. Rule 1 of the Order is amended -
(a) by deleting the definition of "Act" and substituting the following definition -
"Act" means the Decentralization and Local Government Regions Act No: 1 of 1994;"
(b) by inserting after the definition of "Act" the following definition -
"ballot paper" means a printed paper in the form of Form D in Schedule 1 produced by the Electoral Commission containing the list of a single party;";
(c) by inserting after the definition of "electoral officer" the following definitions -
"example" means an example contained in the annex to Schedule 4 for explanatory purposes only;
"1ist" means a list containing the names of all of the candidates in a party contesting the election for a single local government council;
'party" means a political party or movement or association or coalition of parties or movements or a group of individuals who decide to combine together to seek election as local government councillors;";
(d) by deleting the definition of "ward"; and
(e) by inserting after the definition of "poliing day" the following definition -
"return date" means the date prescribed by the Electoral Commission in respect of any local government council election as the last date on which a list may be lodged by a party*"

## REPLACEMENT OF RULE 4 OF THE ORDER

3. Rule 4 of the order is repealed and the following rule is substituted -
LODGING OF CANDIDATES LIST
4. (a) Any party wishing to have candidates elected to a Local Government Council shall prior to the return date deliver a list of candidates in the form of form A contained in Schedule $I$ together with a declaration of candidature in Form $B$ in Schedule $I$ in respect of each candidate appearing on the list personally to the electoral officer, which delivery shall constitute the lodging of the list.
(b) At the time of lodging the list, the party will pay a fee of VT5:000 for each candidate listed and the list shall be deemed not to have been lodged unless and until the fee is paid. The fee will not be refundable under any circumstances.
(c) The electoral officer receiving the list shall enter the date and time at which the list is received by him in the top right hand corner of the list and shall give a receipt for the list in Form $C$ in Schedule I.
(d) The electoral officer shall immediately thereafter deliver the list to the Electoral Office.
(e) The Party lodging the list shall be entirely responsible for the proper completion of the list: Any list which is not in the form of Form $A$ of Schedule $I$, does not contain the names of the requisite number of candidates and their photographs or is not accompanied by properly-completed declarations of candidature will be rejected by the Electoral Office.
(f) If the name of any candidate (being the same person) is entered on two or more lists for the same local Government Region only the list lodged first will be valid. Any other list will be void.
(g) It shall be the duty of the Electoral Commission to determine whether the name of any person appearing to be the same on any two or more lists is in fact the same person. If the Electoral Comission is satisfied that the person appears on two or more lists, it must notify the party concerned that their list is void as soon as reasonably possible.
(h) If a candidate whose name appears on a list dies after the time at which the list is lodged, the list will remain valid.
(i) If, after the list is lodged, up to two candidates whose names appear on the list are declared to be disqualified or ineligible for or withdraw from the election, the list shall remain valid. If more than two candidates are declared ineligible or disqualified, or withdraw the list will be void.
(j) The number of candidates appearing on the list shall be equal to the number of seats in the Local Government Council concerned plus fives Example As Any list containing less than this number shall be rejecteds. If any list is lodged which contains more than this number the excess names shall be deleted by the Electoral office, starting at the foot of the 1ist:
(k) No alteration may be made to the list or the order in which candidates' names appear on the list after the list has been lodged.

REPLACEMENT OF RULE 5 OF THE ORDER
4: Rule 5 of the Order is repealed and the following rule is substituted -
"DEGLARATION OF INVALIDITY OF GANDIDATURE BY THE ELECTORAL COMMISSION
5. (1) When a list has been lodged in compliance with rule 4 the candidates on that list shall stand for election unless and until the Electoral Commission declares their candidature invalid or evidence is given to the satisfaction of the Electoral Commission that a candidate has died, or the candidate has withdrawn by notice in writing to the Electoral office:
(2) The Electoral Commission shall only declare a list invalid on the following grounds -
(a) more than two candidates on the list are ineligible, are disqualified or have withdrawn after the lodging of the list;
(b) the list does not comply with the provisions of rule 4.
(3) Where the Electoral Commission decides that a list is invalid it shall so endorse the list giving reasons for the decisions"

REPLACEMENT OF RULE 6
5. Rule 6 of the Order is repealed and the following rule is substituted -
"RESUBMISSION OF DEGLARATION OF CANDIDATURE BY CANDIDATES
6. Notwithstanding the provisions of rule 4(e) but subject to the provisions of rule $4(k)$, the Electoral Commission may, where it considers that a list is invalid by reason of a bona fide error, not less than 14 days before polling day request the party concerned to resubmit a valid list within 72 hours after such request."

INSERTION OF NEW RULE 6A
6. After rule 6, insert the following new rule -
"BALLOT PAPER
6As (a) The Principal Electoral Officer shall prepare a ballot paper in respect of each Party in the form of Form D in Schedule $I$.
(b) The ballot paper shall contain the name of the party and its logo (if any) and shali, subject to the provisions of sub-paragraph (c) be printed on paper of the colour chosen by the party on the list lodged by the party.
(c) If two or more parties select the same colour or if the colour chosen by a party is not reasonably obtainable, the Electoral Commission may substitute a different colour. The choice of colour will be in the discretion of the Electoral Commission but they shall take account of any tradition of use of such colour by any particular party.
(d) Each party's ballot paper shall contain the names of all of those candidates appearing on the list of the party concerned in precisely the same order as they were listed in that list.

AMENDMENT OF RULE 7 OF THE ORDER
7. Rule 7 of the Order is amended -
(a) by deleting the words "A list of" and substituting the words "All lists of";
(b) in paragraph (a) by deleting the words "District Commissioner" and substituting the words "former local government council"; and
(c) in the last paragraph by deleting the words "re-submitted candidatures" and substituting the words "re-submitted 1ists"

REPEAL OF RULE 8 OF THE ORDER
8. Rule 8 of the Order is repealed and the following rule is substituted -
"declaration without a poll
8. If only one valid list has been lodged by the return date, the Electoral Commission shall declare those candidates elected who appear on the list down to the number of seats avallable in the local government council region concerned:"

AMENDMENT OF RULE 12
Rule 12 of the Order is amended -
(a) in the headnote by deleting the words "ONE CANDIDATE" and substituting the words "ONE LIST";
(b) In subrule (2) by deleting the words "one candidate" and substituting the words "one list".

AMENDMENT OF PART V OF THE ORDER
10. Part $V$ of-the-Order-is-amended
(a) by deleting the word "PRESIDENTS" and substituting the word "CHAIRMEN" wherever it occurs;
(b) by deleting the word "PRESIDENT" and substituting the word "CHAIRMAN" wherever it occurs;
(c) by deleting the words "DEPUTY PRESIDENTS" and substituting the words "DEPUTY CHAIRMEN" wherever they occur;
(d) by deleting the words "DEPUTY PRESIDENT" and substituting the word "DEPUTY CHAIRMAN" wherever they occur;
(e) in rule 19 in subrule (1) by deleting the words "president and a deputy president" and substituting the words "chairman and not more than three deputy chairmen";
(f) in rule 19 by repealing subrule (4) and substituting the following subrule -
"The election of each deputy chairman shall be in accordance with subrules (1), (2) and (3).";
(g) by repealing rule 20 ;
(h) in rules $21,22,23,24,25,26$ and 27 by deleting the word "president" and substituting the word "chairman";
(i) in rules $21,22,23,25,26$ and 27 by deleting the words "deputy president" and substituting the words "deputy chairmen" wherever they occur in those rules;
(j) in rule 27 by deleting the word "presidents" and substituting the word "chairmen";
(k) in rules 24 and 27 by deleting the words "deputy presidents" and substituting the words "deputy chairmen".

## AMENDMENT OF RULE 33 OF THE ORDER

11. Rule 33 of the Order is amended -
(a) by repealing subrule (1) and substituting the following subrule -
"(1) There shall be an Election Disputes Committee which shall consist of 3 members, one of whom shall be the Chairman, who shall be appointed by the Chief Justice by notice-published in the-Gazettes'1;
(b) by deleting the words "Minister may" and substituting the words "Chief Justice may"; and
(c) by repealing subrule (3).
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AMENDMENT OF RULE 40 OF THE ORDER

(ii) by deleting the word "was" and substituting the word "were".
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## AMENDMENT OF RULE 41 OF THE ORDER

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13. Rule 41 of the Order is amended -
(a) In the first line of subrule (1) by inserting after the word "candidate" the words "or candidates"; and
(b) in subrule (1)(c) by deleting the words "the candidate" and substituting the words "subject to the provisions of rule 4(1), a candidate".
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## REPLAGEMENT OF RULE 42 OF THE ORDER

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14. Rule 42 of the Order is repealed and the following rule is substituted -
"EXAMINATION OF VOTES CAST
42. The Election Disputes Committee may direct an examination of the counted and void votes and of the counting of votes."
ADDITION OF NEW RULE 48 OF THE ORDER
15. After rule 47 , add the following new rule -
11 FILLING-OF VAGANGIES
48.(a) If at any time, for whatever reason (whether death, resignation, disqualification or otherwise) any seat in a Local Government Council becomes vacant, the next unelected candidate appearing on the list on which the vacating candidate appeared will be elected.
(b) Such election shall be effective upon the Electoral Commission so declaring by notice in the Gazette."

(b) Immediately on receiving the ballot papers, the voter shall enter the polling booth and place the ballot paper of the party of his choice in the envelope and place all other ballot papers in the rubbish bin in the polilng booth.
(c) The voter shall then present himself to the returning officer who, without touching it, shall verify that the voter is tendering one envelope only and the voter shall place the envelope in the ballot box. This shall constitute the casting of the vote.
(d) Immediately after casting his vote, the voter must leave the polling stations"

ADDITION OF NEW SCHEDULE 4 OF THE ORDER
29. The following schedule and annexes are added as Schedule 4 to the Order -

## "SCHEDULE 4

Method of determining which candidates are elected

## DEFINITIONS

1. "primary seats" means a number of seats on a Local Government Council equal to one half of the total number of seats available on that council provided that if the total number of seats shall be an uneven number the number of primary seats shall be rounded up to the nearest whole number: Example B .
"primary candidates" means those candidates of a list equal to the number of primary seats beginning with candidate number one at the top of the list and ending with (but inclduing) the candidate with the number equal to the number of primary seats; Example $C_{*}$
"secondary seats" means the seats avallable for Councillors on a Local Government Council other than the primary seats; Example D
"electoral quotient" means the product of dividing -
(a) the number of valid ballot papers cast in a Local Government-Council-election by-
(b) the number of secondary seats in that Local Government Council,
shown arithmetically as -
(a) total number of votes cast
(b) number of secondary seats $=$ electoral quotient

If the electoral quotient is a fraction it will be rounded up to the next whole number. Example E.
"secondary proportion" means the number of times the electoral quotient will go exactly into the votes cast for a party; or the votes cast divided by the electoral quotient rounded down to the next lowest whole number; Example $F$.
"remainder" means the remainder of votes cast for each party after the electoral quotlent multiplied by the secondary proportion has been deducted shown arithmetically as
votes cast - $\underset{\text { quotient }}{(\text { electoral }} \times \underset{\text { proportion })}{\text { secondary }}=$ remainder; Example $H$
For the purpose of these rules, any candidate who has died, or (subject to the limit referred to in principal Rule 4(1) of this Order) withdrawn, been disqualified or declared ineligible shall be deleted and the list shall be re-numbered accordingly.

## PRIMARY SEATS

2. (a) The primary candidates of the party which has had most votes cast in its favour will be elected to the primary seatse Example C .
(b) In the event that paragraph (a) does not apply because an equal number of votes has been cast for two or more parties, the primary candidates of the party, the average age in years of all of whose candidates appearing on their list is the greatest will be elected.

## SECONDARY SEATS

3. (a) Subject to rule 4 of this Schedule, the number of secondary seats allocated to each party shall be equal to the secondary proportion. Example F.
(b) The unelected candidates who appear next in numerical order on the ifst of each party entitled to an allocation of votes under paragraph (a) shall be elected, down to the number of such secondary proportion* Example G*

REMAINING SEATS
4. (a) If any secondary seats remain without an elected councillor after the process referred to in rule 3 of this Schedule, the remaining secondary seat or seats shall be allocated to the party with the highest remainder, with any remaining seat going to the party with the next highest remainder. and so on until all of the seats are allocated. Example $I_{\text {. }}$
(b) The unelected candidate next appearing in numerical order on the list of the Party concerned shall be elected in respect of each such allocation. Example J.
(c) In the event of an equal remainder, the eldest candidate eligible for election to the seat shall be elected.

ANNEX I

EXAMPLES

## EXAMPLE A

Region $X$ has 17 seats
$17+5=22$

Therefore 22 candidates must appear on the list of any party contesting the election.

Example B
$17 \div 2=8: 5$
rounded-up
The number of primary seats in Region $X$ is 9 .

## Example C

Candidates numbered 1 to 9 inclusive on the list of each party contesting the election in Region $X$ are primary candidates.

EXAMPLE D
$17-9=8$
There are 8 secondary seats in Region $X$.

## EXAMPLE E

If 11,376 valid votes are cast in Region $X$

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The electoral
quotient =}\frac{11,376}{8}=1,42
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## EXAMPLE F

If Party A receives 4,800 votes, its secondary proportion will be $4,800 \div 1,422=3.38$. Rounded down to 3 . It will be allocated that number of secondary seats.

## Example G

If Party A obtained the most votes so that its primary candidates were elected, candidates numbers 10,11 and 12 will additionally be elected.

If Party $A$ did not obtain the most votes, candidates 1, 2 and 3 will be electedz

## EXAMPLE H

$40800-(1,422 \times 3)=534$

Party A's remainder is therefore 534.
EXAMPLE I
If there are two seats remaining unfilled and there are two other parties who have remainders of -

& \text { Party C }-204
\end{aligned}
$$

The first unfilled seat shall be allocated to party $A$, the second to party B.

## EXAMPLE J

If party $A$ obtained the most votes so that its primary candidates were elected, this will result in candidate No 13 being elected $(10,11+12$ having been elected under rule 4)."

If party A did not obtain the most votes, this will result in candidate No. 4 being elected (1, 2 and 3 having been elected under rule 4)""

List a, which obtained the most votes, receives $50 \%$ of seats, ie: $19 / 2=9: 5$, rounded up to $10-10$ seats.
$19-10=9$ secondary seats.
II Determining the electoral quotient
total votes cast/secondary seats $=10087 / 9=1,120.78$, rounded up to 1,121 .

III Secondary proportion
