REGULATIONS

- Title and Commencement - (1) This order may be  
cited as the Customs Port of Entry Order 1982.  
(2) This order shall come into force on the day  
after its notification in the Gazette.
- Port of entry declared - The port mentioned in  
the schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a port of  
entry for the purposes of the Customs Act 1913, and the  
limits of the port shall be those specified in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

PORT OF ENTRY

<u>Name</u>	<u>Limits</u>
Omoka (Island of Penrhyn)	All that portion of sea and land comprised within a circle with a radius of one mile from the Initial Station concrete block peg situated near the Government Residency in the village of Omoka in the Island of Penrhyn which peg is situated at latitude 8 degrees 58 minutes 45 seconds south and longitude 158 degrees 3 minutes and 33 seconds west.
