Regulations

- 1 Title These regulations are the Justices of the Peace (Remuneration) Regulations 2021.
 - Commencement

These regulations come into force on 1 January 2022.

3 Interpretation

In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—
Act means the Justices of the Peace Act 2017
Ministry means the Ministry of Justice

- (2) Any term or expression that is defined in the Act and used, but not defined, in these regulations has the same meaning as in the Act.
- 4 Remuneration of JPs
- (1) A JP summoned by the Registrar under section 15 of the Act for a sitting of the court is entitled to remuneration for time—
 - (a) attending the court hearing:
 - (b) reasonably required to do work preparing for, or related to, the court hearing:
 - (c) attending meetings that the Registrar requires the JP to attend.
- (2) Remuneration is payable at a rate of up to \$60 per hour of the time spent by the JP, inclusive of any applicable tax, and is paid by the Ministry.
- (3) For any period of hearing time that is less than 1 hour, the remuneration must be apportioned accordingly.
- (4) The remuneration is in addition to the payment to the JP of any expenses and travelling allowances of a type considered appropriate by the Ministry from time to time.
