3. A pilot whilst proceeding on a vessel from one port or place to another port or place shall be provided with accommodation and subsistence on such vessel equal to that enjoyed by the vessel's senior officers. If not so provided a pilot shall be paid in respect of accommodation twenty shillings a day and in respect of subsistence twenty shillings a day. 4. A pilot standing by a vessel if not provided with accomodation and subsistence on board the vessel equal to that enjoyed by the vessel's senior officers shall be paid such sum as is reasonable for his accommodation and subsistence ashore.

5. A pllot who is entitled to be paid the charges prescribed in paragraph 2 (d) above shall also be paid such sum as may be reasonable for his accommodation and subsistence whilst travelling or returning and shall also be paid towards the cost of his transportation a sum of not less than that normally charged for mavel by taxi, aeroplane or passenger vessel.
