AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 7-19, as amended by Public Law No. 7-36, by amending sections 1, 2, 13 and 16 to appropriate the sum of \$204,969 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1992, as supplemental funding for the operations of the executive branch and the legislative branch of the National Government, to amend the budget for Compact section 221(b), to raise the employment ceiling of the National Government, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:
