PUBLIC LAW NO. 19-95

AN ACT

To appropriate a supplemental budget in the amount of \$1,148,684 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2016, by amending sections 1, 2, 3, 8, 9 and 11 of Public Law No. 19-32, as amended by Public Laws No. 19-45, 19-61, and 19-83, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 19-32, as amended by
2 Public Laws No. 19-45, 19-61, and 19-83, is hereby further amended
3 to read as follows:

4 “Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is as follows:
5 To appropriate the sum of \$81,090,899 from the General Fund
6 of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year
7 ending September 30, 2016, for the purpose of funding the
8 operations of all branches of the National Government of the
9 Federated States of Micronesia, its agencies, various
10 programs, grants, subsidies and contributions and Capital and
11 Human Resources Development. The National Government’s share
12 of the Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero except
13 that the National Government will retain 10 percent of the
14 Supplemental Education Grant funds as is reflected in the
15 budget for the Department of Education. The sum appropriated
16 herein shall be apportioned as follows:”

17 Section 2. Section 2 of Public Law No. 19-32, as amended by
18 Public Law No 19-83, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

1 "Section 2. Operating expenses of the Executive
2 Branch. The sum of \$19,503,899, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the
4 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia
5 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2016, for

7 Executive Branch of the National Government during

6 Section 6. Section 11 of Public Law No. 19-32 is hereby
7 amended to read as follows:

8 "Section 11. Reprogramming. Reprogramming of funds
9 into or from the personnel budget line item shall not
10 be permitted. The President, Speaker and Chief Justice
11 may reprogram up to 10 percent to or from the funds
12 appropriated in sections 2 (Operating expenses of the
13 Executive Branch), 3 (Operating expenses of the
14 Legislative Branch), and 4 (Operating expenses of the
15 National Judicial Branch). Reprogramming of funds
16 within a department, office or agency shall be
17 effected by the head of such department, office or
18 agency by specifying in writing to the Secretary of
19 the Department of Finance and Administration of the
20 FSM National Government, the accounts for which
21 funding is either increased or decreased. For one
22 time only, reprogramming is permitted of the remaining
23 \$4,280 from fixed assets to personnel of the National
24 Election Office in section 7 of Public Law No. 19-32
25 in order to pay for the actingship as Election

1 Commissioner in Chuuk from prior fiscal year.
2 Reprogramming other than as specified herein is not
3 permitted, and more specifically, reprogramming into
4 or out of any line item contained in section 8
5 (Grants, Subsidies and Contributions) or section 9
6 (Investment: Capital and Human Resources) is not
7 permitted. The President shall report to Congress
8 within one month of the last day of each financial
9 quarter all amounts reprogrammed inter or intra a
10 department, office or agency."

11 Section 7. This act shall become law upon approval by the
12 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its becoming
13 law without such approval.
