The Customs Tariff Amendment Ordinance 1932

No. 6 of 1932

- I, the Administrator of the Island of Nauru, do hereby enact order and proclaim as under :-
- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the <u>Customs Tariff Amendment</u>
 Ordinance 1932, and shall come into operation on and from <u>Bight</u> o'clock
 in the forenoon of the twenty-fourth day of September 1932.
- 2. The <u>Customs Tariff Amendment Ordinance</u> 1922, as amended by the <u>Customs Tariff Ordinance</u> 1924, is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- 3. The Principal Ordinance as amended by this Ordinance may be cited as the Customs Tariff Amendment Ordinance 1922-1932
- 4. The Schedule to the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting all figures and words from and including "l. Cigars" to "be assessed as l gallon", inclusive, and inserting in their stead the following figures and words:-

For the purpose of Items 4 to 8, inclusive, hereinbefore specified -

(a) Six reputed quarts or 12 reputed pints or 24 reputed half-pints shall be assessed as 1 gallon;

- (b) 'Spirituous' means containing more than two per cent. of proof spirit;
- (c) Spirits in cases of two gallons and under shall be assessed as two gallons; over two gallons and under three gallons as three gallons; over three gallons but not exceeding four gallons as four gallons; and so on, provided that small bottles and phiels of liquor intended for samples or other special purposes only may be entered at actual measurement;
- (d) 'Proof' or 'proof spirit' means spirit of a strength equal to that of pure ethyl alcohol compounded with distilled water so that the resultant mixture at a temperature of 60° Fahrenheit has a specific gravity of 0.91976 as compared with that of distilled water at the same temperature."
