STATUTORY RULES.

No. 11 of 1928.

By-laws made under the Land Ordinance, 1911-1927.

- 1. These By-laws may be cited as the Samarai Swimming Baths By-laws, 1928.
- 2. The baths shall be open at all times to both sexes.
- 3. Separate dressing rooms are provided for men and women and are marked accordingly and persons must use only those separate dressing rooms so allotted to them. Boys are to use the men's dressing rooms and girls the women's dressing rooms.
- 4. All persons using these baths must be decently clothed. The costume to be worn by both sexes is to be from neck to knee.
- 5. No person shall wilfully damage the property of the Trustees or commit any nuisance upon the premises.
 - 6. No native shall be allowed in the baths or upon the premises.
 - 7. No vessels of any description shall be moored to any part of the baths.
 - 8. No fishing shall be allowed from any part of the baths.
- 9. No rubbish, stones or any other matter shall be thrown into the baths or upon the premises.
- 10. No dogs shall be allowed in the baths or upon the premises and the owner or keeper of any dog so trespassing shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.
- 11. All persons making use of the property of the Trustees shall observe the comfort and convenience of others and in the water especially shall refrain from all acts which are likely to endanger or frighten persons who cannot swim or children.
- 12. Any person who commits a breach of or is guilty of an offence against any of these by-laws shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
