REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER "THE NATIVE REGULATION ORDINANCE OF 1908."
(No. XXV. of 1909).

- 1. The Regulations dealing with Native Matters made under *The Native Regulation Ordinance of* 1908, on the fifteenth day of March, 1911, and published in the *Gazette* dated the 24th day of April, 1911, are amended as follows:—
 - (i) By inserting the following new Regulation after Regulation 82:—
 - "82A. (1) If any native shall have in his possession any article used or capable of being used for clothing or bedding and which in the opinion of a Magistrate is in such a condition as to be a source of danger to the health of such native or any other native such Magistrate may order the native in whose possession it is to burn such article.
 - (2) If any native disobeys an order under this Regulation he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One pound or in default of payment to imprisonment for any term not exceeding Two months or to such imprisonment in the first instance.
 - (3) No compensation shall be paid for any article so burned."
 - (ii) By cancelling paragraphs (8) and (9) of Regulation 87 and substituting the following paragraph therefor:—
 - "(8) Any native--
 - (a) who is liable to be selected to carry for the Government and who runs aways, hides, or absents himself to avoid being selected for that purpose; or
 - (b) who after having been selected by the Chief or Village Constable to carry for the Government refuses or wilfully neglects to do so—

shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds or in default of payment to imprisonment for any period not exceeding Three months or to such imprisonment in the first instance."

- (iii) By inserting in paragraph (10) of Regulation 111 after the words "to arrest offenders" the words "inside or."
