

STATUTORY RULES.

No. 3 of 1920.

REGULATIONS

Made under *The Native Regulation Ordinance of 1908.*

(No. 25 of 1909.)

The Regulations dealing with Native Matters made under *The Native Regulation Ordinance of 1908* on the fifteenth day of March, 1911, and published in the *Gazette* dated the twenty-fourth day of April, 1911, are further amended by cancelling Regulation 116 and by inserting in lieu thereof the following new Regulations:—

- “116. (1) A Magistrate may order any native to do any act which is for the good government and well-being of the natives;
- (2) If any native appears on reasonable grounds to a Magistrate—
- (a) to be about to engage in any act which is forbidden by these Regulations; or
- (b) to be engaged, or about to engage, in any act which is likely to prejudicially affect the good government and well-being of the natives the Magistrate may order him to desist;
- (3) if any native without reasonable excuse disobeys any order given under paragraphs (1) or (2) of this Regulation he shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Ten shillings or in default of payment to imprisonment for any period not exceeding one month or to imprisonment in the first instance for any period not exceeding one month;
- (4) a report giving particulars of every case dealt with under this Regulation and of the grounds upon which the Magistrate gave his order shall be forwarded to the Government Secretary by the Magistrate who adjudicated on the case.
- 116A. (1) If any native without reasonable excuse disobeys the order of any Magistrate authorized by these Regulations such native shall, unless some other penalty is imposed by the Regulation authorizing the order, be liable upon conviction to a fine not exceeding Ten shillings and in default of payment to imprisonment for any period not exceeding one month or to imprisonment in the first instance for any period not exceeding one month;
- (2) a report giving particulars of every case dealt with under this Regulation shall be forwarded to the Government Secretary by the Magistrate who adjudicated up on the case.”
