STATUTORY RULES.

No. 9 of 1938.

Made under the Petroleum (Prospecting and Mining) Ordinance, 1938.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Petroleum (Prospecting and Mining) Regulations, 1938.
- 2. Every application for a permit or an extension thereof shall be addressed to the Lieutenant-Governor and be lodged with the Director of Mines.
- 3. The fee payable upon the application for an extension of a permit shall be £5 for every 1,000 square miles or part thereof the subject of the permit.
- 4. Any person who knowingly makes any false statement in an application for a permit or for an extension thereof or who omits any material particular required therein with intent to mislead shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and shall be liable upon summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds.
