STATUTORY RULES.

No. 7 of 1928.

Made under the Port Moresby Electric Light and Power Ordinance, 1925.

The *Electricity Regulations*, 1925 (Statutory Rules No. 3 of 1925), are amended as follows:—

- 1. (a) By repealing the words and figures "One shilling and Threepence (1s. 3d.)" in Sub-paragraph (a) of Regulation Two under the Sub-heading "Lighting" and substituting the words "One shilling" in lieu thereof.
 - (b) By inserting in Sub-paragraph (d) of Regulation Two under the Sub-heading "Lighting" after the words "(libraries and similar purposes)" the words "or for Government purposes not elsewhere provided for."
 - (c) By adding after Sub-paragraph (d) of Regulation Two under the Sub-heading "Lighting" the following new Sub-paragraph:—
 - "(e) For all electricity used for lighting purposes for hospitals at a flat rate of Threepence per Unit."
 - (d) By adding after Sub-paragraph (d) of Regulation Two under the Sub-heading "Power" the following new Sub-paragraph:—
 - "(e) For all electricity used for power purposes for hospitals at a flat rate of Threepence per Unit."
- 2. By repealing the words and figures "One shilling and Sixpence (1s. 6d.)" in Regulation Five and substituting the words "One shilling" in lieu thereof.
- 3. By repealing the words and figures "One shilling and Sixpence (1s. 6d.)" in Regulation Six and substituting the words "One shilling" in lieu thereof.
- 4. By repealing the words and figures "One shilling and Sixpence (1s. 6d.)" in Regulation 14A and substituting the words "One shilling" in lieu thereof.
- 5. By omitting from Regulation Fifteen the words "Electric Authority" where secondly occurring.
- 6. These Regulations shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of July One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight.
- Made in Executive Council this seventeenth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight.
