

# STATUTORY RULES.

No. 3 of 1939.

Made under the *Petroleum Ordinance, 1927.*

The regulations contained in the Schedule to the *Petroleum Ordinance, 1927*, are further amended as follows:—

1. By inserting therein immediately after Regulation 5 the following new regulation and heading:—

“*Magazine for over 400 gallons contained in approved drums.*”

5A (1) A licence for a private magazine to store more than 400 gallons securely contained in metal drums only which are of an approved size and pattern may after application therefore has been approved by the Lieutenant-Governor be issued by the Licensing Officer in respect of a magazine which is separated from any other building and which is used only for the storage of petroleum and is situated not less than thirty feet or such other distance as the Lieutenant-Governor may in any particular case approve from any other building.

(2) For each such licence the applicant shall pay to the Licensing Officer the sum of Two Pounds.

(3) The general construction of any such magazine shall be as follows:—

(a) The drums shall be stored within a dwarf wall constructed in the manner set out in Sub-regulation (3) (a) of Regulation 5 of the Schedule;

(b) have a roof as set out in Sub-regulation (3) (d) of Regulation 5 of the Schedule;

(c) in addition to the dwarf wall the magazine shall be surrounded by a screen wall constructed as required by the proviso to Sub-regulation (3) (c) of Regulation 5 of the Schedule;

(d) The general provisions as to private magazines shall apply as far as practicable.”
