

STATUTORY RULES.

No. 8 of 1924.

Made under *The Public Service Ordinance of 1907* (No. 2 of 1907).

1. The *Public Service Regulations, 1922* (Statutory Rules No. 2 of 1923) are amended as follows :—

(a) By omitting from Sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 54 the words “ on the salary of such officer ” after the word “ centum ” and inserting in lieu thereof the words “ on the minimum salary of the group in which the officer is classified irrespective of the value or condition of the building so occupied.”

(b) By inserting after Sub-regulation (2) of Regulation 54 the following Sub-regulations :—

“ (3) When a building is provided and made available as a residence for an officer such officer shall not be exempt from the payment of rental by reason of the fact that he occupies some other building or refuses to occupy the building provided.

(4) When a building is provided as a residence for an officer and such building consists wholly of native materials no rental shall be charged any officer for the occupation thereof. Whether such building consists or does not consist of native materials shall be decided by the Lieutenant-Governor in the event of any dispute arising in relation thereto.

(5) When a building is provided as a residence for an officer and such building does not consist wholly of native materials the officer occupying such building as aforesaid shall be charged so much rental (if any) for the use thereof as the Lieutenant-Governor may deem just but in no case shall the rental charged exceed the amount fixed by Sub-regulation (1) hereof.

(6) Where a portion of the building provided for the residence of an officer is used as an office the Lieutenant-Governor may make such reduction in rental (if any) as he deems just.”

2. These regulations shall come into operation and take effect on the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four.
