STATUTORY RULES.

No. 4 of 1932.

Made under the Samarai Electric Light and Power Ordinance, 1926.

The Samarai Electricity Regulations, 1926 (Statutory Rules No. 1 of 1927), are further amended as follows:—

1. By inserting at the end of Sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 2 thereof the following new paragraph and sub-heading:—

"Stand-by rate: a consumer desiring a supply of electricity to supplement a supply from a privately-owned plant or for use as a substitute on occasion of a failure of supply from such a plant shall for any electricity supplied to him pay an added charge of twenty-five per centum of the ordinary rate: Provided that notwithstanding anything elsewhere contained for every installation connected with a meter of the Electric Authority on premises in connection with which a privately-owned plant is used a minimum charge of Twenty shillings per month shall be made whether electricity is consumed in the month or not."

2. These Regulations shall be deemed to come into operation on the third day of February, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.
