

ARMS, LIQUOR AND OPIUM PROHIBITION REGULATIONS. ⁽¹⁾

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Arms, Liquor and Opium Prohibition Regulations*. ⁽¹⁾ Short title.

2.—(1.) In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears— Definitions.

“Ordinance” means the *Arms, Liquor and Opium Prohibition Ordinance 1921-1938*.

(2.) Any reference in these Regulations to a form shall be read as a reference to a form in the Schedule to these Regulations.

3. A liquor permit under section 6A of the Ordinance shall be in accordance with Form 1: Liquor permit.

4.—(1.) An employer’s arms permit under section 11 of the Ordinance shall be in accordance with Form 2. Employer’s arms permit.

(2.) The fee for the issue of an employer’s arms permit in duplicate shall be Two shillings and six pence.

(3.) The fee for the issue of an office copy of an employer’s arms permit shall be Two shillings and six pence.

5. A native shall not give or lend the duplicate or the office copy of an employer’s arms permit supplied to him by his employer to another native, and the duplicate or the office copy shall be produced to any District Officer, Patrol Officer, or European member of the New Guinea Police Force on demand. Giving or lending copy of employer’s arms permit by native forbidden, &c.

Penalty: Two pounds or imprisonment for three months.

6. Every employer, before entrusting any firearm or ammunition to a native in respect of whom an employer’s arms permit has been issued, shall supply to the native a duplicate or office copy of the employer’s arms permit. Employer to supply native with copy of permit.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

EMPLOYER'S ARMS PERMIT.

Under the powers conferred upon me by the Administrator under the provisions of section 12 of the *Arms, Liquor and Opium Prohibition Ordinance 1921-1938*, I hereby authorize _____ of _____ to entrust to _____ a native, while such native is employed by him as a labourer or servant under the *Native Labour Ordinance 1935-1938*, firearms and necessary ammunition for the purpose of shooting for and under the directions of the said _____.

This permit shall remain in force for a period of twelve months from the date hereon, unless revoked under the *Arms, Liquor and Opium Prohibition Ordinance 1921-1938*.

NOTE.—The native named in this permit whilst carrying firearms or ammunition under this permit shall carry a duplicate or office copy of this permit, and it shall be produced to a District Officer, Patrol Officer, or European member of the New Guinea Police Force on demand. It shall not be given or lent to another native.
