

NATIVE EDUCATION TRUST FUND REGULATIONS 1924.⁽¹⁾

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Native Education Trust Fund Regulations 1924*.⁽¹⁾

2. Moneys of the Native Education Trust Fund expended under the provisions of the *Natives Taxes Ordinance 1921*⁽²⁾ and the *Education Ordinance 1922*⁽³⁾ for the general and technical education of natives and for purposes having for their object the direct benefit of these natives shall be classified under the following items, viz. :—

Item No. 1.—Salaries, wages and allowances of officers of the native educational staff.

„ 2.—Pay and allowances, including food, clothing, &c., of native and Asiatic labour employed on the native education staff.

„ 3.—Pay and allowances, including food, clothing, &c., of native trainees under instruction.

„ 4.—Equipment of educational establishments.

„ 5.—Materials for instructional purposes and manufacture.

(1) The *Native Education Trust Fund Regulations 1924* (made under the *Education Ordinance 1922-1938* and the *Natives Taxes Ordinance 1921-1938*) comprise the original *Native Education Trust Fund Regulations 1924*, as amended by the other Regulations referred to in the following Table:—

(a) All these sets of Regulations were made under both the *Education Ordinance 1922-1938* and the *Natives Taxes Ordinance 1921-1938*. At the relevant dates in 1924-1929, Section 6(2) of the *Education Ordinance 1922-1938* provided that "Regulations made under this Section shall come into operation upon publication in the *New Guinea Gazette*", whereas the *Natives Taxes Ordinance 1921-1938* made no provision for the date on which regulations made thereunder were to take effect. The first three sets of Regulations (namely those dated 23.5.1924, 27.3.1925, and 24.8.1925 and published respectively in *N.G. Gaz.* of 31.5.1924, 31.3.1925, and 31.8.1925) each stated in their respective introductory parts that they were to come into operation on 1.6.1924, 2.4.1925, and 1.9.1925 respectively, that is, a date other than that on which they were published in *N.G. Gaz.* The last two sets of Regulations (namely those dated 8.1.1926 and 13.12.1929 and published respectively in *N.G. Gaz.* of 15.1.1926 and 31.1.1930) each stated in their respective introductory parts that they were to come into operation "forthwith". At the relevant dates in 1924-1929 there was no other Ordinance or regulation of general application providing for the publication of regulations, the date on which they were to take effect, or the meaning of "forthwith".

(3) Now the *Education Ordinance 1922-1938*.

EDUCATION—

- „ 6.—Expenses incidental to the sale of vocational products.
- „ 7.—Rent and repairs and maintenance of buildings used for the purpose of the education of natives.
- „ 8.—Proportion of general administration expenditure chargeable to the native education trust fund including the proportion of salaries and wages of officers and employees of the Administration whilst engaged on native education duties.
- „ 9.—Miscellaneous expenditure in connexion with the education of natives.
- „ 10.—Expenditure incurred other than in the education of natives, but having for its object the direct benefit of natives.

Where works of a capital nature are undertaken which are required for the purpose of the education of natives of the Territory, or for purposes having for their object the direct benefit of such natives and which are chargeable to the Native Education Trust Fund, a special item will be allotted to each work.

Trainees will be provided with rations and clothing, &c., as provided by the schedules hereto:—

- (a) Trainees at technical schools in accordance with the First Schedule;
- (b) Trainees at the elementary schools in accordance with the Second Schedule.
