

PUBLIC SERVICE ORDINANCE 1926. ⁽¹⁾

No. 14 of 1926.

An Ordinance to nullify the approval of the abolition of certain offices, and the creation of certain offices, and for other purposes.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, pursuant to the powers conferred by the *New Guinea Act 1920-1926*, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Public Service Ordinance 1926.* ⁽¹⁾ Short title.

2. The approval of the abolition of offices and of the creation of offices given by the Governor-General on the third day of March, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six in pursuance of section sixteen of the *Public Service Ordinance 1922-1925* ⁽²⁾ and signified in writing on Minute Paper for the Executive Council, dated the twenty-third day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, bearing Departmental Number 56 and Executive Council Number 11, shall be deemed to be null and void and to have been at all times of no effect, and any act or thing done after the thirty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, by to or before any person purporting to act as the District Officer, Rabaul, the District Officer, Talasea, or the District Officer, Gasmata, shall be of such full force and effect as if the approval of the Governor-General had not been given.
