To enact a budget law for Fiscal Year 2017 through the authorization of the sum of \$\$\$7,555,673 from the National Treasury for the annual general operations, special revenue, and debt service budget of the Republic of Palau for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2017; to amend Section 2603 of Title 40 to adjust the tobacco product confiscation period; and for related purposes.

THE PEOPLE OF PALAU REPRESENTED IN THE OLBIIL ERA KELULAU DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section I. <u>Short Title.</u> This Act shall be known as and may be cited as. "The Fiscal Year 2017 Budget Act."

3 Section 2. Executive Branch Operations. The sum of \$44,865,500 is 4 authorized for appropriation and is hereby appropriated for expenditure and 5 obligation for Fiscal Year 2017 for the purpose of covering the operational and contingent expenses of the Executive Branch. The total amount authorized to be 6 7 appropriated shall be made up of the following available revenues: The amount of 8 \$26,218,500 shall come from local revenues; the amount of \$13,147,000 shall come 9 from anticipated USDOI-OIA fiscal year 2017 grant assistance provided to Palau; the 10 amount of \$500,000 shall come from the Non-Communicable Diseases Fund, as 11 created by RPPL 9-57, in order to fund the purchase of new medical referral housing in the Philippines and fund the Republic of Palau's Hyperbaric Chamber; and the 12 13 amount of \$5,000,000 shall come from Compact Section 211(f) Trust Fund 14 Investment Account.
