AN ACT to appropriate three million five hundred nineteen thousand six hundred and seven dollars to the service of the year ending 31st December 1989.

ENACTED by the National Parliament of Solomon Islands.

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the 1989 Supplementary Appropriation Act (No. 2) 1989.

Authorisation of issue from the Consolidated Fund of \$3,519,607 to the service of 1989.

2. The issue from the Consolidated Fund is hereby authorised of the sum of three million five hundred nineteen thousand six hundred and seven dollars to be applied to the service of the year ending 31st December 1989.

Appropriation.

3. The sum specified in the preceding section shall be appropriated for supply of the heads specified and in the amounts respectively specified in relation thereto in the Schedule to this Act.
