PART I

REGISTRATION

(i) This part of this Regulation shall apply to dogs both and female over the age of six months.

2) In any prosecution instituted under this part of this nation, the age of the dog to which the proceedings relate shall, absence of proof to the contrary, be presumed to be more than nonths.

The Resident Commissioners may by Joint Decision—

(i) declare areas in the New Hebrides to be Dog Control Areas;

(ii) appoint a Dog Control Officer for each Dog Control Area;

(iii) appoint such person (hereinafter referred to as "appointed persons") as they shall think fit to perform the functions and exercise the powers conferred upon them by this Regulation.

3. (1) Upon receipt of the prescribed registration fee, the Control Officer shall enter particulars of the dog and its owner register which he shall keep for the purpose and shall issue to owner a badge inscribed with a serial number recorded in the ster, which shall be valid up to the end of the calendar year in the it is issued,

(2) In any prosecution instituted under this part of this ulation—

- (i) a copy of any entry in the register certified by the Dog Control Officer shall be admissible and sufficient proof of the contents thereof;
- (ii) a certificate signed by the Dog Control Officer that no entry relating to a particular person or dog has been made in the register shall be admissible and sufficient proof that no registration has been effected by that person or in respect of that dog.

Declaration of Dog Control Areas and Appointment of Dog Control Officers and Appointed Persons.

Registration of Dogs and Issue of Badges.

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(1) Subject to subsection (2), every owner of a dog within Control Area shall in each year register it with the Dog of Officer and pay the prescribed fee therefor, on or before the ay of the month of February in the year for which registration uired.

Every person who during the course of a year first becomes oner of a dog to which this part of this Regulation applies, er by age of the dog or change of ownership, shall cause it to eistered with the Dog Control Officer and shall pay the bed fee therefor within two months of that date.

Every person who shall fail to comply with the provisions section (1) or subsection (2) shall pay to the Dog Control in addition to the prescribed fee for registration a penalty ed by Joint Rules made by the Resident Commissioners for irpose for each complete month during which the prescribed lawfully due and is not paid.

4) Without prejudice to the provisions of subsection (3), every in who shall fail to register a dog required by this Regulation registered and to pay the registration fee and penalty fees if any pect thereof shall commit an offence punishable upon conviction of by a fine not exceeding one hundred Australian dollars or by sonment for a term not exceeding one month or by both such and imprisonment.

(1) Every owner of a dog in a Dog Control Area shall it to wear a collar with a badge valid for the current year hed thereto.

(1) Where an appointed person finds a dog not wearing a in a Dog Control Area, he may seize and impound it.

(2) Where an appointed person finds any unaccompanied doging in a Dog Control Area, he may seize and impound it.

(3) The owner of any dog found by an appointed person ing in a Dog Control Area on two or more occasions within any of twelve months shall be guilty of an offence punishable upon iction by a fine not exceeding twenty Australian dollars:

Where an appointed person has impounded any dog not ing a badge under the provisions of this section, he shall within y-two hours thereof cause a Public Notice in the form bed in the Schedule to this Regulation to be posted in the places where Public Notices are displayed.

Where an appointed person has impounded a dog wearing ge under the provisions of this section, he shall as soon as icable inform the owner thereof.

6) Poundage fees and unpaid registration fees shall be paid in t of every dog impounded under the provisions of this section.

3) Subject to subsection (6), upon payment to the appointed on of the poundage fees due and any unpaid registration fees penalty fees, any dog impounded under the provisions of this on, shall be released to the owner.

(8) If the required fees have not been paid by the expiration of lear days from the posting of the Public Notice, the appointed on may at the direction of a Condominium Veterinary Officer the dog impounded or cause it to be destroyed humanely by an er or agent of the Condominium Agricultural and Animal bandry Department.

8. Where any fees are paid to an appointed person under the visions of this Regulation, he shall issue an official receipt therefor forthwith forward the fees to the Dog Control Officer.

9. This part of this Regulation shall have no application in I ect of guide dogs for blind persons, police dogs or dogs owned or used for the purposes of the Condominium Government, the nch National Administration or the British National Administra-

CONTROL

10. This part of this Regulation shall apply in respect of all whether male or female and, unless otherwise specified, within outside Dog Control Areas.

11. (1) Any person who fails to keep a dangerous dog under per control shall be guilty of an offence punishable on conviction reof by a fine not exceeding one hundred Australian dollars or by prisonment for a term not exceeding three months or by both such and imprisonment:

Provided that it shall be a defence to a prosecution under this tion if the person charged shall prove that the dog was wilfully woked, whether by the complainant or by some other person. Provisions as to fees paid.

Exemptions.

Application of Part II.

Failure to control dangerous dogs.

The District Agents of the District concerned may, upon nviction of any person under subsection (1), order that the dog be destroyed humanely by an officer or agent of the Connum Agricultural and Animal Husbandry Department.

Any dog which has attacked or attempted to attack any in shall be deemed for the purpose of this section to be a erous dog.

2. Any owner of a dog within a Dog Control Area who fully causes or permits it to bark, howl or whine between the hours ne o'clock in the evening and five o'clock in the morning of the wing day so as to cause unreasonable annoyance to other ons shall be guilty of an offence punishable upon conviction of by a fine not exceeding twenty Australian dollars.

3. Any owner of a dog who causes or permits it to enter any nises where food for human consumption is prepared for sale old in the ordinary way of business shall be guilty of an offence shable upon conviction thereof by a fine not exceeding twenty stralian dollars.

14. Any owner of livestock who shall leave a dead carcass furied or unburnt in a place to which any dog may gain access commit an offence punishable upon conviction thereof by a not exceeding sixty Australian dollars.

15. Any person who uses strychnine or any other poison to toy dogs or any other domestic animals or who lays or sets any soned bait in such a manner or place that it may be consumed any dog or any other domestic animals shall commit an offence hishable on conviction thereof by a fine not exceeding six hundred stralian dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one for to both such fine and imprisonment.

16. Notwithstanding the provisions of this Regulation, it shall lawful for any duly authorised officer or agent of the Conninium Agricultural and Animal Husbandry Department to use poisonous substance for the destruction of dogs or to shoot any in order to protect any livestock, under conditions prescribed oint Rules made by the Resident Commissioners.

17. Any owner of a dog who treats it with cruelty or neglect who fails to give it adequate and regular nourishment shall commit offence punishable upon conviction thereof by a fine not exceeding hundred Australian dollars or to imprisonment for a term not ceeding three months or to both such fine and imprisonment.

18. (1) Any owner of a dog who wilfully causes or permits to worry livestock, other than livestock trespassing upon land cupied by such owner, or fails to take reasonable steps to prevent

(2) The owner or other authorised person having charge for time being of any livestock being worried by any dog may if it cessary in order to end the worrying, summarily destroy the dog hooting it:

- (3) For the purposes of this section, worrying livestock Lis-
- (a) attacking livestock, or
- (b) chasing livestock in such a way as may reasonably be expected to cause injury or suffering to the livestock or, in the case of females, abortion, or loss or diminution of their produce.

PART III

MISCELLANEOUS

19. The Resident Commissioners may make Joint Rules for rying into effect the provisions of this Regulation and without ejudice to the generality of the foregoing for the purpose of-

- (a) prescribing fees payable upon the registration of dogs, including a rising scale of fees in proportion to the increasing number of dogs owned by any one person;
- prescribing the penalty fees payable in respect of registra-(b) tion fees lawfully due but not paid;
- (c) prescribing the amount of poundage fees payable;
- (d) prescribing the conditions under which dogs may be destroyed whether by poisoning or shooting by officers or agents of the Condominium Agricultural and Animal Husbandry Department;
- (e) introducing on the advice of the District Agents concerned the compulsory registration of dogs in areas other than declared Dog Control Areas and the application in respect of such areas of any provisions of this Regulation;
- (f) any other matters incidental to the foregoing or necessary for the fulfilment of any duty or function or the exercise of any power by any person under the provisions of this Regulation.

20. In this Regulation, unless the context otherwise requires, rence to the owner of a dog shall include reference to any other on for the time being having charge or control of a dog.

21. (1) Joint Regulation No. 18 of 1934 is hereby repealed.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1), the aration of any dog and the payment of tax thereon under proons of section 5 and section 6 of the repealed Regulation shall nain valid for the period for which the tax was paid as if the dog for that period registered and the registration fees thereon paid are the provisions of this Regulation.

22. This Regulation may be cited as the Joint Control and estration of Dogs Regulation No. 3 of 1971 and shall come into the on the date of its publication in the Condominium Gazette.
