## A JOINT REGULATION

No. 9 of 1934.

prohibit gambling within the Territories and Waters of the New Hebrides.

1. Gambling is forbidden within the territory and waters of New Hebrides.

2. For the purposes of this Regulation gambling shall include the act of betting or of playing or causing to be played any game for stake—

- (a) On any public thoroughfare or in any public place to which the public have access whether of right or not;
- (b) In any place such as defined by Article 3 hereunder, where gambling takes place.

3. Place in which gambling is forbidden by this Regulation hall include any building, house, office, store, shop, room, any temises whether open or closed, any ship, boat or other vessel hoat or not, or any vehicle, in which a game is played for stakes and which the public may have access with or without payment, even such place is used as above described on one occasion only.

4. Any person convicted of gambling shall be liable to a malty not exceeding  $\pounds 20$  (2,480 francs) fine and to imprisonment of exceeding one month.

5. Any person who keeps or manages either for himself or other a place for gambling, or permits gambling on premises of hich he is the owner or occupier or of which he has control, shall liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 (2,480 francs) fine and to prisonment not exceeding one month.

6. Any person who advances or furnishes money for the purpose cambling shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 (2,480 mcs) fine and to imprisonment not exceeding one month.

7. On an offender convicted of a second offence the maximum falty shall be imposed.

8. On a complaint being made that any place is being used for abling the Resident Commissioners acting jointly may authorise

European Official to enter such place. The joint authorisation rempower the said official to effect an entrance and to make a sch of the place and of persons found therein and to seize the tes, securities for moneys and objects exposed for gambling or and in possession of any person in the place and to arrest all persons and therein and, if necessary, demand the assistance and help of police for those purposes.

9. All moneys and articles found exposed for purposes of ming, all furniture, utensils, or apparatus employed or used for mbling shall be confiscated and shall be forfeit to the Condominium overnment.

10. Whoever wilfully obstructs any Official authorised as ovided in Article 8 in the exercise of his duty shall be liable as an complice and subject to the penalties prescribed in Article 4 of this egulation.

11. On the occasion of public festivities the [District Agents if the place concerned] acting jointly may authorise the playing of ames of chance at such places and subject to such conditions as hey think fit. Application for permission shall reach each [such pistrict Agent] at least a week in advance and shall give the names if the persons who will have control or management of the games.

Such persons shall immediately inform the Police of any dispute r disturbance that may cause a breach of the peace.

The Police may then, if they consider it necessary, terminate such blay forthwith.

On any breach of the conditions of the authority to play such tames of chance the authority shall be withdrawn and any future pplication shall be refused and the offenders liable to the penalties prescribed by this Regulation.

12. Nothing in this Regulation shall make it an offence to hay whether for a stake or not (a) a game in any recognised hotel or oarding house, provided that the playing of such game be not of he nature of public gambling (b) any game which is also an athletic kercise.

**[12A.** (1) Every chain-letter game or scheme is hereby declared be unlawful.

(2) For the purpose of this section, the expression "chainther game or scheme" shall include every game or scheme whereby is intended that any person shall receive a letter or other communition inviting or soliciting him to pay out some valuable consideraon to any other person or persons and to send further letters or immunications of a similar nature to other persons in the hope or pectation of thereby receiving some gain or profit.

(3) Any person who shall promote, further, manage, administer,

vertise or conduct a chain-letter game or scheme shall be guilty an offence punishable on convinction by a fine not exceeding the thousand Australian dollars or by imprisonment for a term not ceeding twelve months or by both such fine and imprisonment.

(4) Any person who, not being the promoter or manager or incerned in the administration of a chain-letter scheme, shall send ny letter to any other person in participation in a chain-letter scheme hall be guilty of an offence punishable on conviction by a fine not needing One hundred Australian dollars.

(5) The Condominium Postmaster and every official of the ost Office are hereby authorised to refuse to accept for transmission we mail any letter which is or which he has reasonable cause to aspect may be a letter sent in furtherance of chain-letter game or cheme.]

13. This Regulation shall be cited for all purposes as "The-New Hebrides Gambling Regulation No. 9 of 1934" and shall come into force on 16th December, 1934.
