No. 11 of 1962

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MADE by the Resident Commissioners under the provisions of tele 8, paragraph 3, of the Anglo-French Protocol, 1914.

PART I

GENERAL PROVISIONS

1. In this Regulation—

Interpreta-

d-operative" means a private society of individuals, without restriction on the amount of its capital or on the number of its members, which is conducted in accordance with co-operative principles by natives of the New Hebrides for the promotion of the common economic interests of its members and which has its head office and pursues its activities in the New Hebrides, and includes associations of such societies formed for the management of their common interests;

operative Officers" means the persons appointed as such by the Resident Commissioners jointly.

FORMATION

(1) The intention to form a co-operative shall be set out imple written declaration which shall be signed by at least seven its and forwarded to the Resident Commissioners through the ct. Agents at least sixty days before the Inaugural General ing to establish the co-operative, and which shall set out the date and time of such meeting.

- (d) the nature, origin and employment of its resources, and the manner in which the funds are to be raised;
- its administrative procedure, special reference being made to those matters requiring a decision of the General Meeting and to those matters on which action may be taken by the Committee;
- (f) the provisions for the control of operations and for dissolution and liquidation.
- (3) No co-operative may be registered until its by-laws, royed by the constituent General Meeting, have been duly considered by the Resident Commissioners who will thereafter arrange of mal registration [——].

The registration of a co-operative shall render it a body ofate by the title under which it is registered, with perpetual ssion and with power to hold property, to enter into contracts, to institute and defend suits and other legal proceedings, for purposes it shall be represented by its Chairman.

PART III

CAPITAL AND PROFITS—MEMBERS

(1) No person may become a member of a co-operative he has interests that lie within its range of activities and area ations.

Conditions of membership.

No person may join more than one co-operative operating same purpose in the same area.

Non-members may make use of the services of a cote to the extent provided for in its by-laws.

(1) Unless otherwise provided for in the by-laws the initial of a co-operative shall consist of indivisible shares of the minal value subscribed by the members which shall become certy of the co-operative.

Means of raising and registering funds.

No member other than another co-operative shall hold in one-fifth of the share capital of any co-operative.

Whenever a co-operative obtains a loan, it shall not reduce until the loan has been fully reimbursed.

A co-operative may by decision of a General Meeting its capital for clearly defined purposes.

Every co-operative shall keep at its head office a register is in which shall be entered the names of members in order ion together with the number and value of their shares.

- 7. (1) Not less than one tenth of the net profits of a coperative shall be transferred annually to a Reserve Fund until the mount in the Fund equals the initial capital of the co-operative;
- Provided that the Resident Commissioners may earlier authorise the annual transfers to the Reserve Fund to cease.
- (2). The Reserve Fund shall not be used or invested without prior approval of the Committee and of the Co-operative Officers.
- (3) Any net profits remaining after the annual transfer has an made to the Reserve Fund may be used in one or more of the illowing ways—
 - (a) distributed to members in proportion to the amount of business done by each member with the co-operative; or
 - (b) distributed to members as interest on share capital at a rate not exceeding 6% per annum to the exclusion of any other dividend on share capital; or
 - (c) allocated to any funds constituted by the co-operative for special purposes.
- 8. (1) Any member may withdraw from a co-operative and receive a refund of all or part of his contributions to the coperative unless provision to the contrary is made in the by-laws.

(2) Expulsion shall involve the loss of any right to reimbursent unless a General Meeting or a Special General Meeting decides the contrary.

9. (1) Subject to the provisions of Section 10 (2) hereof, a line may nominate in writing the person to whom all his rights interests in the co-operative shall be transferred in the event of death, and the person so named may—

(a) provided he satisfies the requirements for membership laid down in Section 5 above take over the rights and interests of the deceased; or

(b) require the co-operative to pay to him the value of the rights and interests thus acquired.

(2) If a member of a co-operative has not nominated any in in writing to receive all his rights and interests, the provisions aragraph (1) above shall be applied to his heir according to be custom.

(1) For a period of two years after his withdrawal or ulsion a member shall retain the same liability as other members such debts of the co-operative as existed at the time of his with-ul-or expulsion.

A co-operative shall have a charge upon the shares or the in the capital and on the deposits of a member or past ber or deceased member and upon any dividend, bonus or payable to a member or past member or deceased member

PART IV

PROCEDURE

11. The governing bodies of a co-operative shall be the General setting of its members and the Committee. Their deliberations shall recorded in minutes of meetings and their decisions and instructions shall be carried out by the office bearers and employees of the operative.

- 12. (1) The General Meeting shall be the supreme body, the ce of all authority and of all power within the co-operative.

- (7) Voting by proxy shall be forbidden.
- (8) At least fifteen days' notice shall be given by the Chairman Committee before the General Meeting or a Special General eting is held.
- 13. (1) A Committee shall be elected by the General Meeting among the members of the co-operative and shall manage the irs of the co-operative:

Provided that a Special General Meeting may remove the mmittee or any members thereof before the expiration of their of office by majority of three-fourths of the members present, shall proceed at the same meeting to the election of others in stead who shall hold office until the election of a new Comby the next General Meeting.

As soon as it has been constituted the Committee shall from among its members a Chairman who shall preside at its sions and at the General Meetings and any Special General

The Chairman shall represent the co-operative as plaintiff endant in civil proceedings, and all such proceedings shall be ited by or against him.

The Committee shall also appoint a Secretary who may be member or an employee of the co-operative.

Each member of the Committee shall have one vote only.

Voting by proxy shall be forbidden.

(1) The Committee may recruit and appoint employees, hall not do so from among its members.

The number, designation and wages of permanent ema co-operative shall be shown in its budget.

15. No person may become a member of the Committee or a manent employee of a co-operative if he, either directly or through intermediary, carries on any activity which is in competition or sely connected with that of the co-operative.

Restriction on Membership of the Committee and employees.

PART V

COMMERCIAL AND FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

16. Unless it is otherwise provided by the Resident Comsioners, a co-operative shall be liable to pay the prescribed fees trading licences and shall be subject to any Regulation in force espect of any imports or exports which it may make. Licences and Customs dues,

17. The accounts of a co-operative shall be kept in accordance becommercial practice.

Accounts.

18. (1) A co-operative may obtain loans from one or several members, or from persons who are not members, or from the or bodies outside the co-operative.

Loans obtained.

- (2) Except with the approval of the Resident Commissioners operative shall not obtain more than one loan at a time and, it that loan and any interest thereon is fully repaid, it shall not in another loan nor shall it sell its assets, other than stocks held easle, for any purpose except the redemption of the loan.

PART VI

ECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND SUPERVISION FOR CO-OPERATIVES

0. (1) Whenever they consider it necessary, and once at least try year, the Co-operative Officers or their representatives shall mine the accounts of co-operatives. They may direct particular inting records to be kept and standard printed forms to be used. examination the Co-operative Officers shall make a report to exident Commissioners on the general and financial situation of 50-operative.

Audit and Inspection.

- The Co-operative Officers or their representatives, and strict Agents or their assistants, may visit co-operative installand undertakings at any time and may require the books, minutes and accounting documents of all kinds to be seed for inspection.
- The annual reports on business, accounts, inventories of balance sheets and draft estimates of co-operatives shall be tied to the Co-operative Officers for their examination before all by the Annual General Meeting.

21. Co-operatives which have received financial assistance in form from any organisation approved by the Resident Comassioners for the grant of such assistance shall be subject to supersion by such organisation in a manner to be laid down by agreement ween the co-operative, the organisation and the Co-operative ficers before the financial assistance is granted.

PART VII

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By-Laws

(1) Every member of a co-operative shall comply with By-laws. by-laws.

(2) The making of a new by-law and the repeal of or amendint to an existing by-law may only be done by a majority of not than three-fourths of the members present at the General Meeting Special General Meeting.

No resolution making a new by-law or repealing or amending dristing by-law shall be valid until it is registered [----] under Moint Regulation by the Resident Commissioners. An amendment changes the title of a co-operative shall not affect any right bligation of the co-operative or any of its members or past bers, and any legal proceeding pending may be continued by or first the co-operative under its new title.

Any person shall on request be shown the by-laws of a perative at its head office or be supplied at his own expense with lifted copy of them in one or other of the English, French or i English languages.

PART VIII

DISSOLUTION AND LIQUIDATION

(1) Only the Resident Commissioners may order the Dissolution. tion of a cooperative. They may do so-

on receipt of an application to that effect made by a majority of members; or

on the recommendation of the Co-operative Officers after making an inspection under Section 20 hereof; or

at their absolute discretion if the activities of a co-operative are of a nature calculated to disturb the public peace.

A co-operative shall cease all activity as soon as its disis applied for or ordered and the Resident Commissioners ake such further order as they think fit for the custody of the and documents and the protection of the assets of the ative until the order for dissolution takes effect.

When the order for dissolution of a co-operative takes de Resident Commissioners may appoint a liquidator who possession of all its property, assets and records of whatcription.

24. (i) Liquidation shall be carried out under the supervision and control of the Co-operative Officers in consultation with the district Agents. A detailed report shall be submitted by the liquidator brough the Co-operative Officers to the Resident Commissioners.

Liquidation.

- (2) The liquidator shall forthwith proceed to realise the assets in shall apply the proceeds in the manner and order following—
 - (a) to discharge all debts, loans and other liabilities;
 - (b) to distribute the balance (if any) up to an amount equal to the capital of the co-operative among the members in proportion to the number of shares held by them;
 - (c) to pay the balance (if any) then remaining to the Resident Commissioners to be used by them for any purpose relating to the economic welfare of the natives of the New Hebrides.
- (3) If liquidation results in a deficit exceeding the total assets the co-operative, such deficit shall be made good by the members proportion to the number of shares held by them and to the extent evided for in the by-laws of the co-operative. In this event, the lit of the liability of members shall not be less than twice the count of their shareholding.

PART IX

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

25. The Resident Commissioners may make all such rules as be necessary to carry out or give effect to the principles and ovisions of this Joint Regulation.

Rules

- 26. Any person or co-operative affected by a decision of the dent Commissioners under this Joint Regulation may, within months of the making of the decision, appeal to the High Commoners against such decision. When an appeal is presented in two months, the decision shall not take effect until it is med.
- Appeals.
- 17. (1) No person or group of persons other than a cotive registered in accordance with section 3 of this Joint ulation shall trade or carry on business under a style which ides the word "co-operative" or the word "co-operate" or any derived therefrom;

Prohibition on the use of certain words,

rovided that any person or group of persons trading or carrying usiness under such a style at the date of coming into force of oint Regulation shall within one year cease to make use of such or within the same period apply for registration in accordance section 3 of this Joint Regulation. such word shall cease within one month of the date of refusal; and provided that a group of persons which has forwarded to sident Commissioners a statement of intention to submit a fation in accordance with Section 3 (1) of the Joint Regulation ind is operating under the supervision of the Co-operative Officers hay trade or carry on business under the style of "Probationary co-operative" for a period not exceeding twelve months prior to the obmission of a declaration in accordance with Section 3 (1). If gistration is refused or the supervision of the Co-operative Officers that the case within one month has elapsed, the use this style shall cease within one month of the date of refusal or indrawal as the case may be.

- (2) Any person or group of persons who contravenes the royisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence and on contion shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds sterling or equivalent in francs at the current rate of exchange and to apprisonment for a period not exceeding one month or to one or the ther of these penalties.
- (3) In the case of a continuing offence against this section a rither fine not exceeding one pound sterling or its equivalent in encs at the current rate of exchange may be imposed for each day tring which the offence continues up to the limit of the penalties ovided for under the Anglo-French Protocol of 1914.]
- 28. Any member or employee of a co-operative who shall ifully publish or communicate any incorrect accounting record in intent to deceive shall be guilty of an offence and on conviction all be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds sterling its equivalent in francs at the current rate of exchange and to optisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to one or other of these penalties.

Publication of incorrect accounting record.

29. Save as provided in Sections 27 and 28 hereof any person group of persons or registered co-operative who wilfully offends inst any provision of this Joint Regulation or of any Joint Rules de under Section 25 hereof shall on conviction be liable to a fine exceeding fifty pounds sterling or its equivalent in francs at the tent rate of exchange.

General Penalty.

30. This Joint Regulation may be cited as the New Hebrides tive Co-operatives Joint Regulation No. 11 of 1962.
