We His Britannic Majesty's Resident Commissioner and the Resident Commissioner for the French Republic in the New Hebrides Do HEREBY MAKE the following Joint Regulation.

1. In this Regulation or Rules made thereunder unless the context otherwise requires the following Definitions shall be held to

Definitions.

apply-

"Radiocommunication" means the electrical transmission of writing, signs, signals, facsimiles and sounds of all kinds by means of Hertzian waves;

"Radiotelegram" means a message from one person to another sent or received by radiocommunication by a person duly authorised in that behalf by the Resident Commissioners jointly;

"Transmission" where used in relation to messages includes the reception as well as the sending of the message;

"Public Service" means a service for the use of the public in general;

"Public Correspondence" means every radiocommunication which a station by virtue of its being available for public service must accept from the public for transmission;

"Restricted Service" means a service which may be used only by specified persons or for particular purposes;

International Service" means a service not confined to the New Hebrides Group or its territorial waters;

Amateur" means a person who desires bona fide to conduct scientific research in radiocommunication or a person engaged in the practice of radio with a personal aim and without pecuniary interest:

Broadcast" means the radio-transmission of any message or signal for general reception by listeners;

Listener" means a person who uses apparatus to receive broadcast messages or signals;

Commissioners" means His Britannic Majesty's Resident Commissioner and the Resident Commissioner for the French Republic acting jointly.

- 2. Radio transmission and reception in the New Hebrides hall be under the control of the Resident Commissioners, provided that nothing in this Regulation shall apply to radio when used by ressels belonging to His Britannic Majesty's Navy or the French Navy.
- 3. No person shall establish in the New Hebrides any apparatus for the purpose of radiocommunication without a licence from the Commissioners issued under such conditions upon the payment of such fees as may be prescribed; provided that this section shall not apply to radio apparatus in ships of the Merchant Service or aircraft icensed by another Administration. Applications for licences shall be made to the British Resident Commissioner in respect of British subjects and ressortissants and to the French Resident Commissioner in respect of French citizens and ressortissants.

Licence to establish radiocommunications.

4. No radiocommunication except a message affecting navigation shall be transmitted to or received from any place outside the New Hebrides by any vessel or aircraft which has duly entered the New Hebrides but not cleared therefrom unless such message is passed through the Condominium Wireless Station at Vila or such other station in the Group as may be directed by the Resident Commissioners.

Restriction on radiocommunication by ships and aircraft.

5. No radio apparatus installed on board a merchant ship shall be worked or used while the ship is in any of the Harbours of the New Hebrides except with the special or general permission of the Resident Commissioners.

Prohibition of use in harbours.

6. Upon application made in the form of schedule 2 (a) or 2 (b) hereto, whichever be appropriate, and under such conditions as they may deem fit to impose and upon payment of such fee as they may prescribe, the Resident Commissioners may grant licences in the form of Schedule 3 (a) or 3 (b) hereto, whichever be appropriate, to any person to establish a station for radiocommunication on land or on board a ship and to make in respect of transmissions or ecception such charges as may from time to time be authorised by the Resident Commissioners. It shall be a condition of any licence solved under this Section that the licensee shall observe the stipulations of the International Telecommunications Union. These licences hall be issued by the Condominium Postmaster.

Licence to transmit and receive radiotelegrams.

J.R. 15 of 1962. 7. Under such conditions as they may deem fit to impose and receipt of an application in the form of Schedule 4 hereto the sident Commissioners may issue to any person desiring to become amateur who has passed the test prescribed in Schedule 8 and also been granted the Certificate of Proficiency set out in hedule 9 a licence in the form of Schedule 5 hereto. This licence fall be issued by the [Controller of rates & taxes] and countersigned to the Resident Commissioners.

Amateur's licence.

8. Every holder of an amateur's licence shall use only apparatus nich conforms to the International Convention and is approved to the Resident Commissioners. Every holder of such licence shall foreover present for inspection by the Resident Commissioners a fave-meter apparatus of a satisfactory standard of precision which hall be kept in use at all amateur transmitting stations.

Duties of Amateur.

9. Every holder of an amateur's hoence may apply for a rificate of competency in Schedule 7 hereto issued on the recommendation of a Commission composed of the Chief Operator and sistant Operator of the Vila Condominium Wireless Station and a pullified operator of one of the mail or inter-island vessels of the ame nationality as the applicant for the licence. The tests for the ramination of the applicant shall be those set out in Schedule 6 hereto. At the discretion of the Resident Commissioners the abovementioned certificate shall entitle the operator of an Amateur ransmitting Station to handle commercial traffic to and from the Vireless Station at Vila. This certificate shall be issued by the Chief Vireless Operator and countersigned by the Resident Commissioners.

Local certificate of competency.

10. Any person desiring to become a listener shall procure a licence in that behalf from the Resident Commissioners. Such licence shall be in the form of Schedule 1 hereto and shall be subject to such conditions as may be prescribed. This licence shall be issued by the Condominium Postmaster.

Listener's

11. Subject to the provisions of Articles 3 and 4 hereof and such other conditions as they may consider necessary the Resident commissioners may issue licences for radiocommunication under the conditions of Article 6 hereof to vessels and aircraft registered at the New Hebrides. The master of any vessel or aircraft so licensed hall be bound to accept transmit and receive radiotelegrams at the raffic rates fixed by the Resident Commissioners.

Licences for ships and

12. Upon application in the form of Schedule 10 hereto and inder such conditions as they may deem fit to impose and upon the ayment of such fee as they may prescribe the Resident Commissioners may grant a licence to broadcast in the form of Schedule 11 reto. Such licence shall be valid for one year but may be extended the discretion of the Resident Commissioners upon such terms and conditions as they may deem fit to impose; provided that the sident Commissioners may at their discretion permit any person

Licence to broadcast.

J.R. 5 of 1954. sed under Articles 6 or 7 hereof to carry out experimental dcasts (under such conditions as they may deem fit to impose) fout taking out a broadcast licence. Such permission may be drawn at any time without notice.

13. The fees to be charged for licences shall be prescribed by at Decision of the Resident Commissioners. Fees shall be collected the Condominium Postmaster and no licence shall be issued until requisite fee has been paid.

Licence fees.

14. Notwithstanding anything in this Regulation respecting issue of licences the Resident Commissioners may cancel or pend any such licence at any time if circumstances seem to them make such cancellation or suspension necessary.

Cancellation or suspension of licence.

15. No person shall be employed as an operator at a radionomitting station within the New Hebrides or on board any vessel aircraft registered in the New Hebrides unless he is a British or each subject and holds a Certificate of Competency as required the International Convention. Nationality of operators and certificates.

16. The Resident Commissioners and any person duly authord by them shall have the right at all reasonable hours to inspect

gulation to transmit or receive radiocommunication. If it is found
at the requirements or restrictions laid down by the Resident
ommissioners in the relative licence or in any rules made under this
gulation are not being complied with, the Resident Commissioners
by cancel such licence and may give such order respecting such
ant or apparatus as they may think fit.

Inspection of plant and apparatus.

17. Every person who is required to possess a licence under is Regulation shall exhibit his licence on demand to any Police ficer, District Agent or other person duly authorised by the sident Commissioners.

Inspection of licence.

18. (1) If there be grounds for suspecting that a radio station been established without a licence or that any radio apparatus been installed or worked in any place or on board any ship hout a licence the Resident Commissioner having jurisdiction the alleged offender may issue a search warrant to a Police icer or any other person authorised to execute such warrant to a rand inspect the station place or ship and to seize any apparatus ich appears to him to be used or intended to be used for radiosemission or reception.

Search warrants. and seizure.

(2) In any case where a seizure is made pursuant to the precedsub-article, proceedings for the prosecution of the offender shall astituted within one month of the seizure; and on such proceeda Court may, in the event of a conviction, in addition to any

Penalty which it may impose, order the confiscation of the

paratus seized, and in the event of an acquittal, it shall order the turn of such apparatus.

- 19. No liability shall attach to the Resident Commissioners atly or severally in respect of—
 - (a) Actions, claims or demands which may be made by any person in consequence of any damage arising from anything done by the holder of any licence granted under this Regulation or by his Agents;
 - (b) Anything lawfully done by the Resident Commissioners or any person duly authorised by them in carrying out the provisions of this Regulation;
 - (c) Any error in or omission from any radiotelegram or delay in transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery or for omitting to send or receive any radiotelegram from whatever cause the error, omission, delay, or non-delivery shall arise.
- 20. Radio apparatus installed in any merchant ship in the territorial waters of the New Hebrides whether British, French, or of other nationality, shall be worked in such a way as not to interfere with the working of any radio station lawfully installed and worked in the New Hebrides.
- 21. All apparatus for radiocommunication on board a merchant thip in the territorial waters of the New Hebrides shall be worked a manner as not to interfere with naval signalling.
- 22. It shall be a condition of any licence issued under Articles 6, 7 and 12 of this Regulation that the Licensee shall receive and transmit all meterological messages free of charge.
- 23. (1) The Resident Commissioners may at any time when it seems to them expedient in the public interest to so do jointly issue an order prohibiting (whether absolutely, or from time, to time, or in certain circumstances), or regulating the use of all or any apparatus for radiocommunication in respect of which a licence has been issued hereunder or which is situated on board any aircraft or vessel which has duly entered the New Hebrides but has not cleared therefrom, or directing the possession or control of any such apparatus to be given to the Resident Commissioners or to any person named by them in such order and if any person to whom any such order is directed fails to comply therewith, or uses any apparatus in contravention thereof, then (without prejudice to any proceedings which may be taken against any other person) the occupier of the premises on which the apparatus is situated, or, where the apparatus is on board any aircraft or vessel, the pilot of the aircraft or the master of the vessel as the case may be, shall each be guilty of an offence gainst this Regulation:

Provided that in any proceedings which by virtue of this Article

taken against any person in respect of the use of any apparatus some other person in contravention of such an order, it shall be a ence for the defendant to prove that the apparatus was so used hout his permission and that he exercised all due diligence to event any non-compliance with, or contravention of, the order.

- (2) The minimum fine which shall be imposed in case of a reach of this article shall be ten pounds.
- 24. Without prejudice to the effect of any other article of this tegulation, every person shall be guilty of an offence who—
 - (a) Erects, constructs, establishes, maintains or uses any apparatus capable of radiocommunication without a licence as required by this Regulation;
 - (b) Not being a holder of a licence as required by this Regulation is in possession of any apparatus capable of receiving radio signals;
 - (c) Transmits or receives any radiotelegram from one person to another unless authorised to do so by licence as provided under Article 3 hereof;
 - (d) Being a holder of a licence fails to exhibit such licence to a person duly authorised by the Resident Commissioners;
 - (e) Refuses to carry out any orders issued by the Resident Commissioners under Article 16 hereof;
 - (f) Transmits any false or fraudulent distress or other signal message call or radiotelegram of any kind or who without lawful excuse interferes with or obstructs any radiocommunication;
 - (g) Not being the sender or addressee divulges the contents or the fact of the existence of a radiotelegram otherwise than as he may be required by competent authority or make any use whatsoever of the information contained in any radiotelegram, without prejudice to legal proceedings instituted by the addressee or his representative.

25. Any person convicted of any offence against any article of this Regulation or Rules made thereunder shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £20 or imprisonment not exceeding one month or both.

Penalties.

26. Offences under this Regulation shall be justiciable by the Courts of First Instance or by the Joint Court where the said Courts have not been proclaimed.

Legal proceedings.

27. The Resident Commissioners may from time to time make and vary, add to and revoke when made such Rules as they may deem desirable for the exercise of the control vested in them under Article 2 of this Regulation.

Resident Commissioners may make Rules &c. 28. Joint Regulation No. 1 of 1909 is hereby repealed.

Repeal.

29. This Regulation shall come into force on the day of the the hereof and may be cited as The New Hebrides Radiocommunication Joint Regulation No. 10 of 1939.

TELERADIOPHONE—PRIVATE

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

The Station shall at all times be under the operational control of the Station crintendents at Vila or Santo Radio. All unnecessary transmissions shall be ided and communications kept as short as possible. Direct communication radio stations outside the New Hebrides is expressly forbidden.

TRAFFIC

Teleradio Stations are required to accept reasonable traffic from members the public for transmission to a Condominium Radio Station. Licensees may ain the full internal charge for this service at the rate fixed by the Joint Adminition. Official traffic will be carried without charge. Communications passed vila or Santo Radio for onward transmission will be charged as if handed in at the or Santo.

o) Interstation communication of a non-commercial nature may be made thout charge using the frequency of 4552.5 kcs. No priority will be given in a use of this or any other teleradio frequency. Interstation communication on the frequencies will only be allowed with permission from Vila or Santo Idio. This permission may be specifically for one call only or general for certain criods. Teleradio stations are required to accept telegrams or telephone messages from a Condominium Radio Station without charge to the Joint and National dministrations. They are not required to make journeys to deliver messages to the public.

The licence shall be issued by the Condominium Postmaster, countersigned by the Condominium Radio Engineer and subject to the joint approval of the British and French Resident Commissioners acting jointly.

3. ACCOUNTS

Accounts will be submitted at regular intervals by the Condominium Postmatter and must be paid without delay. Licence fees must also be paid without delay. The names of licencees in arrears with accounts will be notified to the Condominium Radio Engineer who may take action to stop the use of teleradio frequencies by that station.

4. CONTACT

(a) Daily Contact

All Teleradio Stations are required to listen each week-day to at least one of the broadcast traffic lists transmitted by Vila Radio, and to answer calls promptly. Telegrams will be announced for a working period of 24 hours.

(b) Weekly Contact

All Teleradio Stations are required to contact Vila Radio at least once a week and preferably once a day. If the station is closed for any reason advice should be sent to Vila Radio in advance.

Contact must be established as soon as possible after leaving a port, and later than the next scheduled operating time of Vila Radio.

Communication with another New Hebrides ship and with a land station the New Hebrides Teleradio Network is only permitted on a frequency of 5 kcs unless special permission is obtained from the Station Superintendent via or Santo Radio.

en AFFIC

Reports of ship position, estimated time of arrival at a port, and medical are received free of charge, but are not normally communicated elsewhere that in the case of emergency.

Normal traffic, including messages addressed to an agent giving estimated to of arrival, will be subject to a coast-station charge of 9.5 gold centimes per of (= 4d. Australian approx.) or such rate as may be fixed by the Administion.

No credit will be given for traffic received and there will be no internal ayor coast-station charge added to messages addressed to overseas destinations.

All communications and equipment must conform to the regulations laid in by the International Telecommunications Union. The station will be subject inspection by the Condominium Radio Engineer or his representative.
