MADE by the Resident Commissioners under the provisions of agraph 2 Article 2 and Article 7 of the Anglo-French Protocol

- 1. All wheeled traffic shall be subject to the provisions of this gulation.
- The term "vehicle" includes every type of wheeled transport luding tractors.

The term "motor vehicle" includes every vehicle driven by utomotive power, combustion engine or electrical power.

The term "heavy vehicle" includes every vehicle the weight of hich unladen is 2½ tons or more.

The term "common vehicle" means every vehicle transporting the persons or more not including the driver, children of less than years being considered half a person up to a maximum of ten bildren.

The term "motor bicycle" includes every two wheeled vehicle being driven by automotive power, combustion engine or electrical ower but excluding manual power.

The term "police officer" includes both the British and French commandants of Police and every officer or agent of one or other diministration who is authorised jointly in writing to institute proceedings under this Regulation.

The term "licensing authority" means the Collector of Rates and Taxes in Vila and every person authorised jointly by the Resident commissioners in writing to receive such taxes.

The term "public road" includes all roads declared by the resident Commissioners to be public under powers vested in them be so and every road or right of way to which the public may have any time unrestricted right of access.

PART I

GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR TRAFFIC CONTROL APPLICABLE
TO ALL ROAD USERS

Section 1-Control of Vehicles

- 3. Every vehicle, except trailers, must have a driver.
- 4. Every driver must at all times keep his vehicle to the right had side of the road (particularly so when another road user arrives in the opposite direction or is ready to overtake). Overtaking will be place on the left. At cross roads, intersections of roads and ded roads, the driver of any vehicle shall give way to another filing on his right; provided that the driver of a vehicle on a road left has been designated a "major" road by joint decision of the ident Commissioners shall have the right of way, and the driver vehicle on a road on which a Halt Sign has been placed shall the right of way.
 - When a public road is divided by a continuous white line driver must drive to the right of this line.
 - Every driver wishing to draw away from the curb, to overa vehicle travelling in the same direction, to stop or to change don must indicate his intentions clearly by hand or light signal. Ignals used shall be in accordance with Schedule F. Every drivering to overtake another vehicle shall if necessary sound his A driver shall satisfy himself that no danger exists to other users of himself before carrying out the above operations.
 - No driver shall intersect the ranks of military or police liments or processions.
 - No driver shall leave his vehicle in such a way as to obstruct culation of traffic
 - Every driver whose vehicle breaks down on a public road ason of an accident or other cause shall take such precautions necessary to ensure the safety of the public.

- 10. No vehicle using a public road shall emit obnoxious fumes gessive noises.
- 1. Pedestrians using a public highway must not cause nection to traffic. It shall be an offence for every driver or engerin a vehicle by rash or negligent conduct to obstruct other users.

Section 2—Traffic Accidents: Powers of Police Officers and District Agents

15. Every driver involved in an accident causing personal nurry or damage to property must immediately stop his vehicle. If accident involves personal injury, the driver must advise the

PART II

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GENERAL PROVISION FOR VEHICLES

Section 1-Dimensions of Vehicles

10. The width and length of a vehicle including any projections not exceed 8 feet 2½ inches (2,5 metres) and 37½ feet (11 metres) etively. The axle ends shall not project beyond the plane of the fee vehicle, provided that the foregoing measurements shall poly to industrial, commercial, agricultural or animal drawn for which special approval has been given by the Superant of Public Works. The total loading of all vehicles including ficulated vehicles shall not exceed 8 tons per axle, or 24 tons in the absence of special approval from the Superintendent lie Works. Lumber or loose appendages carried on, or forming a vehicle other than tanker trucks, shall be secured so as not lect beyond the external planes of vehicle nor drag upon the while it is in motion or stationary upon a public highway.

Section 2-Tyres

All vehicles shall be fitted with pneumatic tyres or other of a sufficient elasticity approved by the Superintendent of Works.

It shall be an offence for any person to drive a vehicle fitted teel chains on any tarred or metal public highway, or any ghway, except when necessary.

Section 3-Loads

The breadth and length of the load on any vehicle other specifically authorised under Article 20 above shall not seet 2½ inches (2½ metres) and 37½ feet (11 metres) respectived or moveable seats may not project beyond the planes slice.

It is an offence to drive on a public road any vehicle loaded way as to cause danger to the public.

Section 4-Number Plates

25. No owner of any registered vehicle shall drive or permit havehicle to be driven on a public road unless it be fitted with the sain front and at the rear showing the registration number; wided that motor cycles shall require a plate at the rear only. The trees of this number must not be less than three inches high, must lainted white on a black background or, if in relief, to be of a mapproved by the Commandants of Police. The number shall learly visible by day to a person standing 20 yards to the front tear of the vehicle. Section 5—Light Signals and Warning Devices

Motor cycles shall be illuminated by a white or yellow light font and a red light at the rear visible from a distance of 164 yards metres).
- 7. Between sunset and sunrise every person riding a bicycle public highway shall illuminate his vehicle by a white or yellow lamp in front, visible for a distance of 150 metres, and by a red for at the rear.
- 28. Between sunset and sunrise all motor vehicles, excluding of cycles, stationary on a public highway must show, on the off white or yellow light at the front and a red light at the rear.
